



Storage or Racking of privately owned boats policy

All privately owned boats stored in the Clubhouse do so at the Waterford Boat Club (WBC) Committee's permission. The club maintains the right to refuse permission to an individual.

The location of the boats within the club is at the sole discretion of the club Captain.

Only a fully paid-up member may have the opportunity to store their boat in the club.

The Club accepts no responsibility for damage to an individual's boat or equipment.

A Liability waiver must be signed by the owner (if under 18 years, a parent/guardian) and returned to the club to keep on file.

A Racking fee will be imposed on boats stored in the clubhouse. The fee will be determined by the Committee.

The Racking fee is for the calendar year 1st January to 31st December each year and is due on the 1st January for the year to come.

All privately owned boats must be insured by the owner. Proof of insurance must be provided.

Exemptions to the Racking fee

Removal of privately owned property from the clubhouse

Failure to pay the Racking fee or membership lapse may result in the boat being refused permission to be stored and requested to be removed from the premises.

WBC will issue a written request to remove the property from the premises. If, after 3 months, this does not suffice, a Demand Letter will be sent to the property owner via Registered Post, requesting the removal of the said property.

Failure to remove property from the clubhouse 3 months after a Demand Letter is sent by registered post may result in the selling of the property by the club to recoup costs involved, including but not limited to: Legal fees and costs relating to selling of the property, as well as the Racking Fee owed.
